Fujitsu Services Manchester

Thank you for your letter dated 13th March and received 16th March regarding our dispute with Amicus.

We are pleased to note that the union has called off the proposed strike action following your intervention. This enables us to return to negotiations in the hope of reaching an early resolution of the dispute.

Our view is that, as ACAS have already assisted us in a conciliation capacity, it would be appropriate to ask that organisation to continue that role. I understand that at the last ACAS meeting, before Amicus resumed its strike activity, agreement had already been reached on the structure of the next meeting.

As an organisation we are committed to positive relationships with our recognised trades unions. The situation in Manchester differs markedly from that in the rest of Fujitsu Services.

While only a small number of people have taken industrial action we wish to resolve the dispute as quickly as possible. However this is not a national dispute and therefore I am asking Roger Leek, Group HR Director to write to you and suggest a way forward.

Thank you for your interest and I can assure you I will keep in contact with situation through Roger Leek.
