Unite is asking Fujitsu to honour its agreements and to stop picking on employee representatives

Fujitsu is the second biggest IT supplier to UK central and local government. Fujitsu is here at conference to promote better communication through super-fast broadband and to promote its image of Corporate Social Responsibility.

Unite members working at Fujitsu are proud of the work they do and the services they deliver. But they are frustrated that some of those at the top of the company are undermining workers' efforts. Those at the top are rewarded with all-expenses paid trips, enhanced pension payments and increased packages while workers are undervalued.

Victimisation

Would Fujitsu's claims to promote communication be more credible if the company respected and valued the contribution of employee representatives?

Unite members at Fujitsu Crewe are taking industrial action in defence of Alan Jenney, a prominent union representative who was dismissed on 11th July. To carry out this dismissal Fujitsu broke agreements with Unite as well as Alan's own contract of employment.

Does this help Fujitsu's claims of Corporate Social Responsibility?

Breaking Agreements

Unite members at Fujitsu in Greater Manchester are taking industrial action over a breakdown in industrial relations, breaches of agreements and victimisation of reps. Fujitsu is breaking agreements covering union recognition, redundancy and redeployment, pensions, pay and benefits.

If employees could trust the company to honour its agreements, Fujitsu would find it easier to gain the trust of customers that it would deliver on its contracts.

Disputes Could Be Easily Solved

Fujitsu could resolve these disputes straight away, simply by honouring its agreements and treating reps fairly. Is that too much to ask of a major company receiving billions of public funds?
